IMPROVING THE LIVES OF YOUNG LEGATEES

The Wellbeing Grant by Police Health continues to be a vital resource for young legatees, with over \$15,000 in activities claimed in 2024. It has enabled young legatees to engage in a wide range of activities that promote their physical, emotional, and social wellbeing.

Each young legatee receives \$500 annually, which they can allocate to activities of their choice. These are often activities that may otherwise be financially out of reach.

This year, recipients used the funds for a broad range of enriching experiences, such as martial arts classes, school camps, gym memberships, and more.

These choices reflect the flexibility and inclusivity of the grant, catering to varied interests and needs.

Introduced to support police children coping with the death of a parent, the Wellbeing Grant by Police Health started in late 2023.

Its aim is to ensure young legatees remain active and engaged, providing a sense of normalcy and joy during challenging times.

Police Health Chief Executive Officer, Scott Williams, said he was delighted to see the benefit it brings to police families.

“We are very proud of the success and positive impact these grants have made on the lives of young legatees,” Scott said.

“We strongly believe this support can help strengthen the SA Police Legacy community.”

“Our vision is to create a healthier future together with our members, and supporting the Wellbeing Grant helps that vision come to life,” he said.

Police Health is the not-for-profit, member based, private health insurance fund that has stood behind the policing



community going on 90 years by providing quality, tailored health cover they can trust.

The fund also extends to the emergency services community, through its partner brand, Emergency Services Health.



BENEFITS OF BEREAVEMENT SUPPORT GROUPS

In 2024 we started our first SA Police Legacy support group. Meeting quarterly across the year, thirteen legatees joined us to share stories and understanding, tips and ideas for coping, and discuss different topics of interest.

The purpose of the group was to help legatees by:

- making them feel more connected to others and less isolated in their grief
- providing a supportive environment for them to express their feelings
- providing opportunity to share and learn.

Grief Australia (2014) says, "Bereavement support groups are distinctive in their capacity to create a safe, compassionate and empowering environment for the bereaved to unfold their individual narratives around their grief journey in a way that is organic, practical and integrative. The bereaved can feel less isolated, begin to make some sense and meaning

of their loss and, on the completion of the group, leave feeling more resourced psychologically, spiritually and socially."

This is shown in the feedback from those attending our meetings:

"This is a place where we can share our stories, shed tears and feel safe".

"The discussions made me proud that I have come further than I thought".

"[I] feel comfort in knowing that I am not alone in grieving".

"It is nice to know we are all in the same boat and I appreciate being involved with the Police Legacy group".

"You've helped me understand more about my feelings".

"You truly make a difference to our journey and our healing".

An additional benefit of attending a support group is helping others. When people share their experiences and what they have learned, it can show others they are not alone and, in turn, help that person with a sense of giving back and making meaning of their own loss.

If you are a legatee and have been considering joining us at a meeting, please do.

We know it can be daunting if you are feeling vulnerable, but you will be welcomed with understanding and compassion. Reach out to us if you need some extra support and encouragement.

GENEROUS \$100,000 DONATION FROM THE HOMETOWN FOUNDATION AND ROMEO FAMILY

The Hometown Foundation is an American charity that raises money through an event called **The Dream Ride Experience.**

Funds raised are used to support people with intellectual disabilities or who are seriously unwell, animal welfare, and emergency services and military workers, including police.

In 2018, The Romeo Retail Group brought The Dream Ride Experience to Australia.

The Hometown Foundation's founder Michael Bozzuto was in Australia for the annual Dream Ride event held on 10 March, 2024 at Glenelg. Here he met retired police officer Stuart Churchill who was escorting in the parade on his motorbike. Stuart served in NSW Police and moved to SA many years ago where he has actively participated in South Australia's fundraising. It was Stuart's connection and stories of service that sparked Michael's interest in SA Police Legacy.

"I was chatting to Michael about my service in the NSW Police force and how I have always held Police Legacy close to my heart as I had lost close friends in the course of our duties. Michael listened intently and seemed so genuine in his concern for our families of fallen police



and how we honour those that have paid the ultimate price in service to our community." Stuart explained.

During the event's formal proceedings Michael then announced a huge \$100,000 donation to SA Police Legacy! It was an overwhelmingly generous amount and will help to ensure our services are available for South Australian police officers and more specifically, the children of police who have passed away.

When speaking to us about Police Legacy, Michael said, "For more than two decades, tallying 100 visits and counting, Australia consistently holds a substantial piece of my heart. Not only do I adore the people of Australia, but I respect and appreciate all that law enforcement does to keep the country I love safe. Police officers selflessly give their expertise, loyalty, and dedication and at times all this costs them their lives.

The loss is immeasurable for families left to cope without their loved ones. The least the community can do is protect the ones left behind and do this without hesitation.

For the last 24 years, in the United States, our foundation has done just

that for police officers who currently serve us, and the ones who gave the ultimate sacrifice to protect us. Our organisation has provided over 50 fully trained and equipped K9 officers, motorcycles, police cruisers, bodycams, motorcycle helmets and more.

The donation pledged during Dream Ride Australia, alongside the Romeo Family is a token to show our sincerity and appreciation to your organisation.

During times of bereavement or serious illness, we all need to continue to come together. Yes, we are separated by 15,000 miles and land and sea, but our missions align side by side. We are here to add to the support of South Australian police families by offering financial, emotional and social comfort. You can always count on us; it is a badge of honor we wear proudly as well."

MEET YOUNG LEGATEE SOPHIE FATCHEN

Seventeen-year-old Sophie Fatchen is a talented, adventurous and amazing young person. About to embark on her year 12 studies, Sophie loves going to the gym, spending warm summer days at the beach with friends and has a passion for travelling. In late 2024, this love of travelling led her to Indonesia where she further explored the culture and language she has studied for the last five years.

We recently spent time chatting with Sophie about her experience with SA Police Legacy and here is what she had to say...



Sophie, can you please tell us about your family and how you came to be involved with SA Police Legacy.

Ten years ago I lost my mother to pancreatic cancer. My father was and still is a police officer and my family – consisting of my brother Izaak and dad Nick, was quickly supported by SA Police Legacy.

How has SA Police Legacy supported you?

Initially SA Police Legacy supported my brother, Dad and I by bringing us together and allowing us to spend time not only with each other, but also with other families who have been through similar losses.

More recently however SA Police Legacy has supported me by funding a school exchange excursion to Jakarta, Indonesia that I would not have been able to do otherwise. I spent 12 days living with my host family in Cibubur Jakarta, and attended Sekolah Pilar with my host sister Luna. Throughout the 12 days I got to explore Jakarta with my friends from school and my host family, but most importantly I was able to learn more about the Indonesian language and culture. This was a once in a lifetime experience and I am beyond grateful for the assistance from SA Police Legacy in providing the funding for me to attend this trip.

Tell us about your studies and what you hope to do when you finish school.

I am heavily focussed on my studies as I am currently preparing to start year 12. My aim is to achieve a position at university in a Bachelor of Human Movement course which will then allow me to gain entry into a Masters for Secondary Education – eventually becoming a High School Physical Education Teacher.

Alongside my compulsory subjects, I am also studying health and physical education, and outdoor education that will create great background knowledge for university. I also elected to do another class at the School of Languages to learn Pitjantjatjara, an Aboriginal language from the APY lands.

What are your favourite sports/hobbies/activities and what do you love most about them?

In my spare time I enjoy creating art as it makes me feel calm and helps process my emotions. I also spend a lot of time with close friends, where we go to the beach, the gym and sometimes camping.

When I can, I enjoy travelling to the countryside to visit friends and family, where we go out for lunch, go fishing and attend art classes.

In terms of sports, I took last season off Aussie Rules Football due to injury but would love to get back into it as I enjoy the teamwork and environment.

What is your favourite thing to do with your family?

I enjoy going out to dinner with my Dad as we sit down and talk over a meal. I also enjoy helping him build things around the house which teaches me great life skills. I love visiting my Nanna as often as I can and enjoy spending time with her as she shows me how to do arts and crafts, using numerous creative mediums and takes me to art classes with her as well.

What have you enjoyed about being part of the SA Police Legacy community?

I enjoy being a part of this community as it means that I always have like-minded people around me and SA Police Legacy also gives me opportunities to meet other young people who have been through similar situations.
